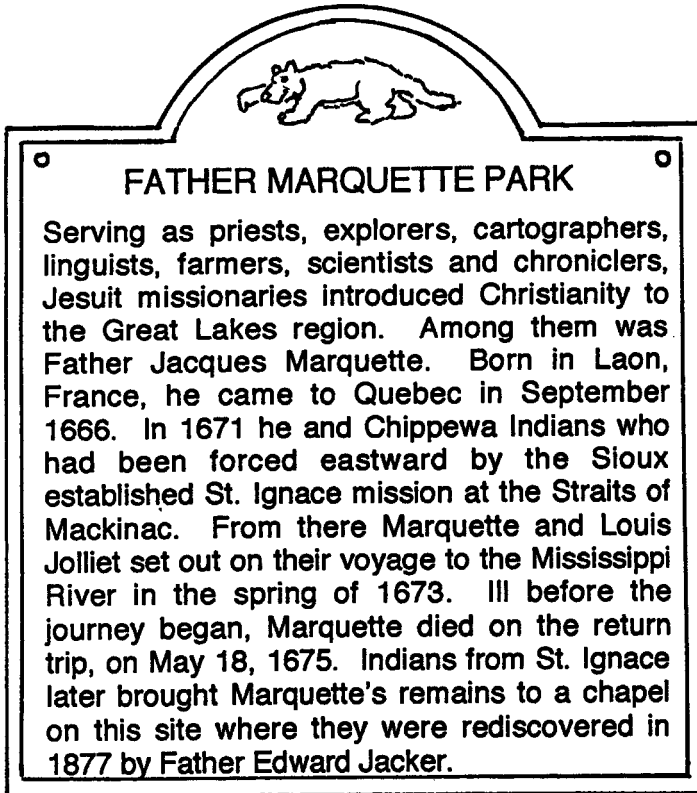


FATHER MARQUETTE

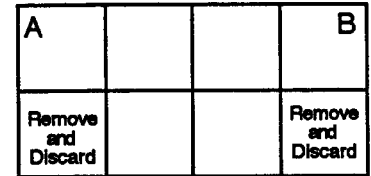

These green and gold signs recognize places, buildings, events, people and institutions that played an important role in the development of our state. Below is an example of a historical marker found in Father Marquette Park, Marquette, Michigan.

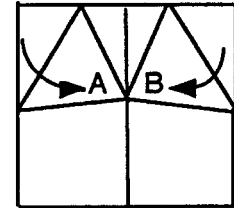


Follow the directions below to make a Father Marquette Fold and Cut Character.

1. Fold a piece of 12"x18" construction paper into eighths.



2. Cut and remove the two bottom corners. Discard.



3. Fold the top corners, A and B, forward to meet where the folds cross in the center.

4. Add head, hands, feet and decorate.
5. On the back, write a sentence for each of the following:

WHAT
WHERE
WHEN
WHY
